DIY Resolutions

When my wife and I bought our 1928 home some 16 years ago, we knew there was much work to be done on it, and me being too cheap to hire anyone, we both knew we were in for a significant longitudinal project. This old home always did have "good bones" but the truth of the matter is it had its share of problems too. Including an interior sheeting of homasote (nasty stuff) as well as low-ph (acidic) water coming from the well.

Over the years, we took each room in our home, gutted it down to the studs, re-insulated, added a vapor barrier, ran new electric, plumbing, HVAC and anything else the room needed then capped it off with new drywall, casings and baseboard.

As we've worked each room in the home, we learned a lot, had a few mishaps (and yes, some words that aren't all too Christian were heard), but ultimately at the end of the day, each room was better than it was before

One of the biggest issues we had with the home was the acidic water, which had taken its toll on the old copper pipes, and they began to fail. So, we tore out every last stitch of copper in the house, added an acid neutralizer system, and replaced all our plumbing with acid impervious PEX.

Replacing the copper with PEX is much like our walk in Christ, when we first became a Christian, we looked at this new "home" with shiny copper pipes (our Christianity), but over the years of walking in Christ, the world takes its toll beating us down (the acidic water) and eventually if we don't pay close enough attention, we may begin to corrode, eventually wear ourselves out, get bitter, or simply lose our ambition to bring Christ to the world. Maybe you've figured you've done enough already and don't need to step up anymore.

As you look back at the past year preparing to start anew by making some resolutions for the year to come, look back at your pipes of life. Things that may have worked beautifully in the past, or still work perfectly for others, may no longer work for you. Maybe instead of a resolution this year, take on a DIY project to upgrade something you already have. Give your walk with Christ a renovation, re-plumb, or maybe even just give a nice fresh new coat of paint. Take on the challenge by Christ himself – the Great Commission to bring Christ into the lives of all we know.
