I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13: 34-35

It's February and it is time to turn our attention to Valentine's Day. I know this because red heart shaped candy appeared in stores the day after New Year's.

It is a time that we focus on the one we love and cherish and praise God for our life together. Love is such an essential segment of our existence. Can you imagine living in a world when there is no one to love or who loves you back? The loneliness would be unbearable. Who do you love? A spouse? Child? Parent? Sibling? Friend?

Here is a deeper question. How do we know what love is, and how do we live into that love? I think we know love because God first loved us. We respond to that deep longing to be with God, to return to our first love by loving one another. Jesus commands that we love one another.

Notice that Jesus said I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. It wasn't a suggestion or a proposition or even a nudge. It is a commandment. If you love Jesus, if you follow his ways, then you are to love one another- even those and, maybe especially those, who are less deserving of your love.

Notice that Jesus said to his disciples to love one another as I have loved you. They certainly did not earn that love; actually, they so often behaved in a way that should have warranted Jesus' disdain and yet, he never gave up on them. His love was sacrificial. He did not love to receive something in return and his love was never based on merit of the disciples. He loved them not because of their actions but despite them. And he never hesitated to believe that they would follow his command to love.

Is it possible for people to know you are disciples of Christ by the way you share love, sacrificially, as Jesus did? Do people who meet you, meet also the love of Christ? If you know Christ's endless, unwarranted love for you, it is your privilege to pass it on so others will know Christ as well.

It is the time of love; make a conscience effort this month to love one another as He loves you.


