Many years back Methodist Preachers traveled from church to church by horseback in order to spread the word of God to a wide expanse. Their territory included many small towns and outlaying villages.

These preachers, almost entirely single men, would be welcomed into local homes for shelter, comfort and good food for the duration of their visit. Often the women of the congregation aided the preacher by cleaning and repairing clothes, making candles for the church and providing music for the service. They were called "Mothers in Israel". This term points to female leaders of the Old Testament, like Deborah, Sarah and Rebekah who were essential to the survival of the Hebrew Nation.

These Mothers in Israel were also essential in the Methodist movement and in the work of the church. They were class leaders, promoters of faith and even, at times, lay preachers. In the absence of the preacher, they visited the sick and attended to church members, knowing who in the community was in need and caring for them.

Many of these women became leaders in Methodism, beginning with Susanna Wesley, who was one of the most influential people in John Wesley's ministry and life and in Methodism.

Churches are often remiss in recognizing the contributions that the women make to the promotion and welfare of our mission. Perhaps one Sunday we should look around and imagine how many areas would be neglected if our women were no longer offering care; Teaching, Preaching, Music, Food, Bible Study, Hospitality, Leadership. This list is endless. And to quote my younger son: "There's no food better than Church Lady food."

On this Mother's Day, take time to approach a "Church Lady" and thank her for all she does for our community of faith. They are all Mothers In Israel.


