Psalm 51: "The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise."

It seems that the Christmas season was only a moment ago and yet here we are preparing for Ash Wednesday! Time is compressed more and more every year. So perhaps we groan to think the season of Lent is upon us. And, sadly, because we are just not ready, we set the time of Lent aside. Please do not let this season of Love pass you by.

This year, befittingly, Ash Wednesday is on Valentines Day. This day is symbolized by Love and pretty red hearts: some hearts are filled with candy, some hearts are drawn by youngsters and colored in, some are decorating cards.

We use hearts to symbolize all the emotions and love and angst that we carry within us: we refer to our hearts as the place where our emotions are located. Indeed, the Day of Hearts is a perfect symbol for the beginning of Lent. We offer our open and contrite hearts to the healing of God.

In Psalm 51 the author, David, speaks of his failure when he speaks of a broken and contrite heart. David recognizes his errors and his sins and is asking for God's redemption. He knows that change will take place in a person's heart only through the love, forgiveness, and power of God.

Do you need a new heart? Is your heart filled with anger, sadness, despair, resentment, fear, addiction, or a bundle of other negative emotions? Has emptiness of sin overshadowed the joy of faith?

Do you have a deep desire for peace within. Is your heart heavy? Perhaps this is the time to pray with David, "Oh, Lord, give me a new heart. And renew a steadfast spirit within me".

Renew your relationship with God on this Ash Wednesday. Open your heart to the Love bestowed on you through Jesus Christ.
