

"The church's congregation is so grateful to have recently been awarded this funding Grant to help with our roof replacement project."



The Northwest CT Community Foundation **Douglas and Janet Roberts Fund** supports the Barkhamsted Historical Society, educational enrichment for Barkhamsted residents, and regional nonprofit programming that benefits the residents of Barkhamsted.

The Pleasant Valley United Methodist Church of Pleasant Valley (a subsection of Barkhamsted) Connecticut was originally built in 1846. This particular church also provides space for a food bank associated with both the church and FoodShare. This funding grant will help to make sure that the building's roof gets replaced, allowing the church's congregation and its food bank mission to both remain in this church building for many years to come.

These are pictures of the first phase of the roof replacement that was completed the end of October. The second phase of the roof replacement is scheduled to start June 1st.
